
ZIKA VIRUS

What you need to know

- The World Health Organisation has declared the Zika virus a global public health emergency
- It is spread by the Aedes Aegypti and the Aedes Albopictus mosquitoes, which also carry Dengue, Yellow Fever and the Chikungunya Virus
- It is usually not harmful in healthy adults but it is the suspected link with Microcephaly in unborn babies, should the mother become infected that is causing such concern



Prevent Zika by...




DEET based repellents



Permethrin treated mosquito net



Cover up with loose, long sleeved clothing in a light coloured fabric



Avoid stagnant or standing water where mosquitoes breed

The Spread of Zika Virus


Zika cases have been found in Brazil, Bolivia, Colombia, Venezuela and Mexico. It is expected to spread rapidly through North, Central and South America, and possibly to South Asia and Africa where the Aedes mosquito is found.
